Program Description

Lakeshore Arts is seeking up to 7 artists to facilitate family-friendly arts activities at public, outdoor tabling events over spring, summer, and fall of 2024. These community events will take place in Etobicoke, and activities will be drop-in style.

Artists will work alongside LSA staff who will host the tables, greet visitors, answer community questions, and assist with activities. Artists will lead arts activities on behalf of LSA.

We are looking for **one artist for each of the following events**:

- Friday, May 24 @ 4PM to 7PM- Community Connects (Pride Toronto event)
- Saturday, June 8 @ 10AM-4PM Local MRKT (Summer theme)
- Saturday, July 13 @ 10AM-4PMM Local MRKT (Caribbean theme)
- Saturday, September 14 @ 10AM-4PM Local MRKT (Back-to-school theme)
