

Ana Barajas is a Toronto based independent curator. She holds a BFA from OCAD University in Sculpture/Installation. She received a MVA, Curatorial and a MA, Contemporary Art History from the University of Toronto. As the Director of YYZ Artists' Outlet, a non-profit artist-run centre, Barajas has managed more than 100 exhibitions to date as well as creating a residency program for YYZ. She has participated in several juries and served on the Board of Directors at the Liaison of Independent Filmmakers of Toronto (LIFT) from 2003 to 2009.

Kim Carson is a Photographer and Visual Artist that shares her talents through educating children and youth.
